Former US Army Colonel, is the vice president of Stratfor.com, an Internet-based, business-intelligence company. He also serves as an adjunct professor at Georgetown University and a Senior Associate at the Center for Strategic & International Studies. Dr. Allard is best known as a frequent television and radio commentator on foreign policy and security issues, especially as a military analyst with NBC News and MSNBC. His numerous publications include two books, *Somalia Operations: Lessons Learned*, and *Command, Control and the Common Defense*, winner of the 1991 National Security Book Award. His 26-year military career included service as an intelligence officer in Germany during the Cold War, as a member of the West Point faculty, and as Special Assistant to the Chief of Staff, United States Army. Wolf Grabendorff

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Responsible for the Latin American Programs of the Research Institute for International Affairs of the *Stiftung Wissenschaft und Politik* (SWP) in Ebenhausen (Germany). Researcher (1966-70) in the Dominican Republic, Mexico, Peru, Venezuela, and was a Visiting Scholar at the Institute of Latin American Studies at Columbia University. Research Associate for Latin American Affairs at the SWP since 1970. This assignment was punctuated by three

years spent as the Latin American Correspondent for the German TV network ARD based in Buenos Aires, and by one year as Visiting Fellow at The School of Advanced International Studies, Johns Hopkins University. Founding Director of the Institute for European Latin American Relations (IRELA), a private, international, bi-regional organization based in Madrid, created with the support of the European Parliament and the European Commission. During his 15 year-term at IRELA (1985-2000) the institute became the leading think tank on European-Latin American relations. He has carried out research on Latin American foreign policy, economic relations and security affairs, as well as on the political development of several Latin American countries, and has published in eight languages, his works comprise more than 100 titles. Lectures frequently in the United States, Europe and Latin America and is consultant to various foundations, governments, and international organizations.

Lawrence S. Graham

BA (Duke University), MA in Hispanic Studies (University of Wisconsin), PhD in political science (University of Florida).

Associate Vice President for International Programs and Professor of Government at the University of Texas at Austin. A specialist in comparative politics and public policy, his work has focused primarily on Latin America and the Portuguese-speaking world, especially Brazil, Portugal, Angola, and Mozambique. For thirty five years he has pursued a career combining teaching and research with program gency for International Development project, overseeing development management programs in the developing world (1987-89), and five years as Director of the Brazil Center at UT Austin (1995-2000). Throughout these years he has been actively involved as chair and executive committee member of the Section on International and Comparative Administration in the American Society for Public Administration and is a past chair of the NATO Fellowship Committee for the U.S. He has published 10 books and over 60 articles in journals and edited books.
